Dear Secretary Wiedefeld, Director Gartner, and Secretary Kurtz:

The undersigned organizations express their support for a separated bicycle and pedestrian facility to be included in the design and construction of the new Chesapeake Bay Bridge.

There are many bridges throughout the US that have separated and safe pedestrian and bicycle paths. The path would provide safe access from the Eastern Shore to the Western, and connect the trail systems in which Anne Arundel and Queen Anne's counties have made substantial investments that are well-used and enjoyed by the communities we serve. More broadly, the path would bring regional and national recognition to the local area, as it would connect to the East Coast Greenway (a National Trail from Maine to Key West), the 911 National Memorial Trail (which connects all three crash sites), and the American Discovery Trail (a Delaware to California National Trail).

As a transportation facility, the shared-use path would provide the first-ever option for commuting by both regular bicycle and by electric bicycle to either side. Given the traffic congestion challenges that the bay crossing endures, having the ability to pedal across will provide many people with the chance to shorten their commuting times simply by hopping on to a bicycle. Bridges across the country in urban and suburban areas have shown that by providing separated, safe bicycle access, many people will choose to commute by bicycle, helping to alleviate congestion.

We envision many other recreational activities that a shared-use path would provide, such as bird-watching, photography, strolling, jogging and running. The path would offer safe access to exercise, recreation and the natural maritime viewscape.

Improving quality of life through either recreational activities or by adding exercise to daily commuting has many indirect benefits to our communities: increased property values, reduced healthcare costs, increased tourism and related commercial revenues, and less stress due to happier people.

We also support including bus transit and ferry connections on the bridge in order to provide multi-modal options that enhance transportation choices for our members. Adding multi-modal options has the potential to moderate vehicle traffic volumes and importantly, provides bridge users with additional ways to cross in busy times.

We see this as a once in a lifetime opportunity to not only improve the quality of life for everyone in the iconic Chesapeake Bay region, but to make the area a world-class destination as many other bridge paths have done.

We stand with our partners and our elected leaders in encouraging you to include the path in the project.
